## March 17, 2024 5th Sunday of Lent



Today we celebrate St. Patrick's Day with the Irish and all who wish to be Irish for the day! Patrick was not Irish, but rather from Briton which is present-day England. His grandfather Potitus was a priest — long before the days that the Church required priests to be unmarried — and so Patrick was raised as a Christian. In his teen years, Patrick rebelled and moved away from his faith. He was captured at 16, most likely by Irish Celtic raiders, and taken to tend sheep in the hills of Ireland. After some time, he experienced a conversion and in his sixth year there, he responded to a dream telling him to escape and find a ship that was ready for him on the coast. He found the boat and returned to his Briton home where his parents welcomed home their Patrick, their own lost sheep.

Soon after his return however, Patrick desired to return to the people of Ireland who he had come to know and love and who were without the Christian faith since the Irish Celts were not Christians. After becoming a priest and eventually a bishop, he returned to Ireland to be with the Irish people for the rest of his life. Patrick loved the Scriptures especially John's Gospel that proclaims our identity and full union in Christ. He absorbed this Gospel so deeply that he became the human embodiment of its message of the love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Patrick had a heart for social justice that is proclaimed in the Gospel. He worked with the Celtic social structures and practices and not against them. He was a gentle and approachable prophet who spoke truth to power, but with invitation, not condemnation; with love, not fear. We need more Patricks in our world today who will speak with Christian voice thar warns against power and profit over people, exclusion over inclusion, and consumerism over care for our earth. So let us read the Lenten text for today in Jeremiah, "I will place my law within them and write it on their hearts; I will be their God and they shall be my people," and welcome a bit more of Patrick into our lives.

I can imagine St. Patrick encouraging us to meditate on the words of the song that include:

"I arise today...

Through Gods strength to pilot me, God's eye to look before me, God's wisdom to guide me, God's way to lie before me, God's shield to protect me, From all who shall wish me ill, Afar and anear, Alone or in a multitude, Against every cruel merciless power That may oppose my body and soul.

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise, Christ to shield me. Christ in the heart of everyone who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me. I arise today."
