

A Reflection from your DJ (Deacon John)

March 24, 2024 Palm Sunday



Today we are entering the very solemn and spiritual final week of the Lenten season with a climax arriving on Easter Sunday! We are hearing a couple of names for today--they are Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday. This sets the stage for what we can expect during this very important time and what we might observe from our Lord Jesus as he experienced these events. He was there to show the people what he wanted them to see.

This reminds me of a quote from St. Francis of Assisi who said, "It is no use walking anywhere to preach unless our walking is our preaching." James Martin SJ, in his recent book, "Come Forth," - about the raising of Lazarus - stresses the concept of us doing both contemplation and action.

During the procession with palms in John's Gospel, Jesus sits quietly on the colt. He didn't teach with words and it took a while for the disciples to understand what was happening. They remembered that it is written that He would be glorified. Everyone felt it.

Then, in the Passion of Mark when Jesus stands silently before the high priests, elders, and scribes, the high priest says, "Have you no answer?" He is asked again by Pilate, "Have you no answer?" Jesus was glorified on Palm Sunday, however he gives absolutely no credibility to being given the death penalty during his trial. His silence makes a point.

As Jesus was walking up the hill to Calvary on that horrible day of the crucifixion, he was silently preaching. Jesus' way is a way of powerlessness, of dependence, of passion. He chose to be among us as one of us. We learn that from this week. Another silent preacher who we can admire is the passerby, Simon the Cyrenian. He was pulled in to carry the cross. He just does it without any complaining or reluctance. Jesus needs us to help to fulfill his mission. He needs people to carry His cross with Him and for Him.

Let us all follow Jesus who often quietly preaches and also learn from Simon, the Cyrenian, who helps carry the cross. We pray and do the work we're called to do. Have a blessed Passion Sunday/Holy Week! Pray and become a person of action!

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

Our Gospel Passion reading begins with Jesus at the house of Simon, the leper, and a woman there who anointed Jesus with expensive perfumed oil. In response to the anger of some (feeling the oil should have been sold to help the poor), Jesus said, "The poor you will always have with you, and whenever you wish you can do good to them, but you will not always have me. She has anticipated anointing my body for burial." Later at the Passover meal. Jesus revealed one of the twelve would betray Him and again tells of His coming death. While they were eating, Jesus, took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." The rest of this reading becomes more painful, but Jesus' mission is very clear. When you consider the humanness of Jesus who knew what He would suffer, how does it make you feel? Could there be any greater sacrifice?
