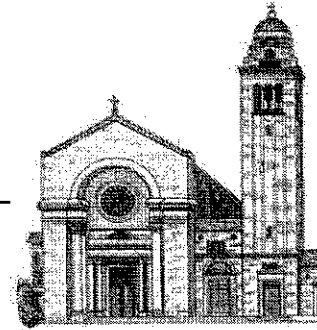

PASTOR'S PEN

I will leave the first reading and the Gospel for the homily but I was intrigued by the words in the second reading when Paul says to "put off the old self of your former way of life...and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth."

Changing any of our bad habits is a difficult task. We have only to ask smokers, dieters, addicts, and any others who have made significant changes in their lives. Paul makes it sound easy as if taking off an old shirt and putting on a new one. Changing behaviors is a difficult task. I have been inspired by the men who have come through the ROPE program. They have decided the "old self" doesn't work anymore. As the statement in NA goes: "they're sick and tired of being sick and tired." What the men have taught me is that you can't sit on the fence. You can't play at recovery. Either you give it all you have or you don't bother. They realize their recovery is not just about abstaining from alcohol and drugs but it's about embracing a whole new lifestyle. They realize they have to be honest and let go of old ways of scheming and manipulating people to get what they want. They have to stop using people and have to begin to look at issues that they have buried and medicated for many years. To take off the old self and put on the new self is not easy and takes a lot of sacrifice and determination. They continue to tell me that putting on this new self, although not easy, has given them a whole new perspective on their life and on the lives of those they love.

Putting on the new self and going through conversion of heart is not for the faint of heart. It's much more comfortable to stay in our sick patterns of behavior. To stay in those patterns is to allow our bodies and souls to slowly die. Christ calls us to new life today. So, what old parts of our selves do we have to leave behind so new life can come. Are we addicted to food or other substances? Are we constantly negative and fighting with those we love? Are we always fearful? Do we ever take a risk? Are we able to forgive and move on from some of the hurts in our life? Are we stuck in judgmental attitudes or self-righteous behavior? What new self is Christ asking us to put on this week? Will we have the courage to change? Please, let's work on one behavior that is old and stagnant and put on a new attitude that calls us to embrace life in a new way!
