PASTOR'S PEN

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

We've heard this Gospel reading many times and we have heard these words of Jesus when asked which is the greatest commandment:

"The first is this: Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

This seems so easy and so basic. Of course, we are called to love God and love our neighbor as ourself. So why are we in such a divided world? I'm not sure but I think it has to do with our relationship with God and with one another. If we truly could enter into the love that God has for us, maybe that would change us. Maybe we'd finally believe that we are lovable as we are. As I've said in the past, I think our Original sin is the belief that we're not good enough or talented enough or lovable enough for God. If we live with that lie then our sense of God is one who judges us, condemns us and is always disappointed in us. How can we have a relationship with a God who is that harsh? When that becomes our core belief, then how can we really love anyone else?

Jesus' mission was to show us the love of the Father through his saving action on the cross. He came to tell us that love calls us to respond in the same manner. We are called to ask ourselves in each situation, "what is the most loving thing I can do at this moment?" Once we allow ourselves to feel God's love, then we begin to see each other with God's eyes. No longer do we see the other as foreigner, stranger, etc but we see them as brother or sister. We see them in their wonderful humanity as a mother's child or someone's father or one who reminds us of a niece or nephew. When we see with the eyes of God, we begin to love and all barriers break down. We gain sight of the reality that we are all one. When a child dies from hunger in a far away land, we all grieve. because we can't fathom losing our child to hunger When there is injustice to those who are most vulnerable, we are outraged because we wouldn't want a member of our family to be treated in such a way. None of us can do everything but all of us can do something to bring goodness and grace into our world. When there's division among us, find something that unites. When there's a racist joke or comment, say something. When people go to lower levels of humanity, take the high road. Our world desperately needs us to choose LOVE.
