PASTOR'S PEN

Baptism of the Lord

Today we take down the tree and the decorations and the ornaments and watch as the Christmas season fades away for another year. All the hurrying and busyness of the season is over and now we settle in to the cold days of winter. It can seem kind of depressing when all you see in the future is snow and cold and the flu and all the wonderful things that make up these months! But we are reminded by Isaiah and by Paul that our God has not abandoned us but the message of Christmas continues throughout our year.

We may put away the lights on the tree but the light of Christ's love burns in our hearts as we take care of each other through the ups and downs of 2019. The beauty of the ornaments and the festive mood of the season may no longer be here but we are called to celebrate our lives with birthdays and dinners and weddings and baptisms and first communions and feasts of all kinds! Yes, the manger scene may be put into storage but we will see the face of the Christ child in the beauty of our children and our grandchildren and maybe, if we're lucky, our great grandchildren! We will see the Christ child in their wonder and awe and joy for life. Christ will be born again and again in their innocence and giggles. We may not hear the story of the flight into Egypt but we will hear the stories of immigrants who will need our comfort and compassion. We may not hear the story of the Magi until next year but we will bring our gifts of gratitude and praise to Christ each week as we approach the altar.

Yes, we put away the trappings of the Christmas season so they will not distract us from the deeper reality that Christ is within us shining brightly like the star on the top of our tree. He is there to warm our hearts and comfort us on the cold days when we feel there will be no end to winter. He will send us angels this year to bring good news to us and remind us of his love. He will also send our closest friends and family to whisper in our ears, "Did you know that you are my Beloved in whom I am so well pleased?"

There is no reason for depression or nostalgia for the Christmas season because we are celebrating it all year long. So put away the ornaments and sweep up the pine needles and wrap up the creche once again for they are merely reminders of a deeper reality.

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom, a light has shone....For a child is born to us, a son is given to us." Let's celebrate the reality of Christmas all of 2019!!
