PASTOR'S PEN

Did you ever have a toothache that completely disabled you or a splinter in your finger that nagged at you all day until

you were able to remove it? It's hard to believe that a little toothache or a splinter could disable a grown person, but it does. It's certainly a reminder that we are a finely connected organism and if one part causes pain, the whole body suffers with it.

Paul reminds us today that we are all connected. We are all part of the Body of Christ. In a world of gridlock and government shutdowns, divisive politics and divisions on all sides, Paul calls us to come together as one body. He reminds us that we are not the same and we don't have to be the same. We just have to work together to produce greatness.

Lately, some have decided that diversity is the cause of our disunity and that unity can only be achieved with people of the same class, ethnic background and all the superficial things that make us seem alike. From that premise come labels. We hear: "Well, he's a Democrat, what do you expect?" or "She's a conservative Republican. I thought she knew better!" or "they're progressives or liberals or right wingers," or 'you know, she's a welfare mother," or "he's a privileged white boy," and our judgments and labels continue to separate us from one another. We may see our labeling as minor but remember the splinter that causes the whole body to suffer.

I am convinced that Paul continues to speak to us in 2019. As we honor and respect all the parts of the Body of Christ, we will begin to witness the Reign of God. It's OK for us to disagree with one another, but it's not OK for us to disrespect each other. Our call is to look for areas where we can agree because, like it or not, our basic humanity reminds us that we are all children of the same Creator. When we cause divisions and speak about "those people," we will never see the Body of Christ in its glory. In these days of "sides," may we all (including myself, especially) allow our words to unite rather than divide.

Let's put aside our differences and tend to the work that is ours: "bringing good news to the poor, proclaiming liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, and letting the oppressed go free" We have our mission.

I feel we have the choice to either be a splinter in the Body of Christ or a healing balm for the broken in the body of Christ. Let's be the balm and stand up boldly for justice and the values of the Gospel but let's do it with as much love and compassion and tolerance we can muster!
