Every time we have a little one welcomed in through the waters of baptism, we are all blessed to have a new child to share our faith. May we inspire Akira with our faith and love for Christ and one another. Akira, please know how grateful we are to have you with us. May you always know that the Lord loves you and walks with you all the days of your life and that this community will support you in any way we can. Rashid and Airika, thank you for bringing Akira to be baptized and allowing us to be part of your joy!

The Gospel today seems to be a wonderful way to introduce Akira to the teachings of Christ. These words on love and forgiveness are hard words to hear, let alone put into practice. How many of us have had the feeling of being duped by someone? We were sure they were being honest with us and then found out later they were scamming us. It's such a violation of trust and leaves us defensive the next time someone asks us for something. The call to "love your enemies and do good to them and lend without expecting anything back" almost seems naïve. None of us want to be taken advantage of or used. As the saying goes, "don't mistake my kindness for weakness." In our efforts to protect ourselves from being used, we can become pretty hard and judgmental.

The last part of today's gospel is always difficult for me to read. I will be judged by the same measure with which I judge. I think of how many times I have judged someone unworthy of my help because I was afraid they were taking advantage of me or were being too greedy or not grateful enough for the "wonderful" things I had done for them. Yet, when I think about how many chances I've been given by Christ even though I have been ungrateful and greedy and dishonest, I am embarrassed. His mercy continues to surround me in spite of myself. As I think of it now, I'd rather feel I was taken advantage of because I tried to do the right thing with love than that I possibly stopped loving for fear that I would be used. Let's not measure our generosity and sparingly hand out our love but let's be extravagant in our love and care for one another. Let's make our measure huge and overflowing!
