PASTOR'S PEN

Second Sunday of Lent

Here we are in the Second Sunday of Lent and I've just heard the news that 49 people were killed in a mosque in Christchurch, New Zealand with many more injured. According to reports, the shooter was a white nationalist who decided the Muslims were invading his "space," and trying to replace white people. Trying to make sense of this horrific act is very difficult. How can someone be filled with that much hatred and rage as to gun down all of those innocent people because they were different from him? How many times will this happen before we realize that something has to change? When anyone who looks different or speaks in a different language or has different customs becomes a threat, something is very wrong.

As followers of Jesus, we are called to see the struggle of our brothers and sisters as our own struggle. It's not enough for us to just sit by and take care of ourselves. We can't just make sure our families are as safe as possible and think that's the end of our responsibility. Our world is filled with fear these days but we can never allow fear to rule our lives or be our motivation in the decisions we make. Each Sunday we celebrate the One who refused to be allow fear to stop him from doing what he knew was right. As his followers, we cannot allow fear or prejudice or anything to separate us from one another. Jesus called for a world where we love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us. He reminded us so many times throughout the scriptures that we are to embrace the stranger and show hospitality to all people but in a special way to those who were suffering the most. Let us take time this Lent to realize our responsibility as followers of Christ.
