PASTOR'S PEN

Today, we hear the story of the blind man being healed by Jesus as well as the choosing of young David to be King rather than his older brothers. It's a reminder to me that there is a difference between sight and vision. Sight is a physical thing but vision is being able to see the deeper meaning of our lives. It is seeing through the eyes of God. The choice of David, the youngest son of Jesse tending the sheep, gives us a little insight into the vision of God. He doesn't just see this youngster with no experience, but he sees a king.

In the Gospel, Jesus doesn't just see blindness and spend his time on the questions of why the man was born blind. What Jesus sees is a person, someone's child, who is struggling and needs compassion and healing. While those around him want quick answers to explain why this man is born blind, Jesus only cares about the individual. How many times did people pass this man by and blame his blindness on his own sin or the sins of his family? How many were not able to see beyond the disability? I think it's easy to label people and blame victims for their problems so that we feel justified in not helping. "He's alcoholic and he just needs to stop drinking," or "she's a single mother and, well, she's made some bad choices...," or "if he would just get a job, his mental illness would go away." Please know I think tough love is important and would not endorse enabling addictions and bad behavior but I'd like to consider what God's vision would be for these people? Wouldn't God see them with a vision of who they were meant to be? God didn't create anyone to be an addict or poor or end up in prison or in shelters or on a soup kitchen line. No. God created them for victory. When we make judgments on others and those judgments keep those people away from us, we are seeing with our limited sight. Maybe our prayer this Lent is to ask the Lord to help us to see as he sees. Perhaps, we ask for the vision to see more deeply into the struggle of those we have labeled as not worthy of our time or help.

The other question we may want to ask this week is what vision God has for each of us. Was God hoping that we would do greater things than we've done because we've settled for mediocrity? Is our playing it safe keeping us from living the vision of God? Are our fears keeping us back from living the full life God has envisioned for us? What are God's dreams for each of us and for those in our world? We will need some quiet time during Lent to try and understand the vision God is calling us to see. We will have to prepare our hearts so that we might allow ourselves to see life in new ways and from a different perspective. The question is do we really want to see in new ways or have we become comfortable with our short sightedness and blindness?
