

PASTOR'S PEN

Fifth Sunday of Lent

On this fifth Sunday of Lent, we are given a preview of what is coming in the weeks ahead. We hear of the death of Lazarus and the pain of losing a friend. We are all reminded of the sting of death and the finality it brings to our lives. "I will never see this loved one again," or "how could God take this person from my life?" is often the refrains I hear as I try to sit with people in their grief. We remember today, as we hear the scriptures, that just as death was not the end for Lazarus, so too, death is not the end for us. Jesus has much in store for us.

Some would say that thinking of life after death is just "pie in the sky" or wishful thinking or a crutch to get us through a tragedy. Maybe... but then I see the crocuses breaking through the ground in the last week. In soil that was as hard as concrete, much was going on under the surface. What seemed like barren wasteland and death was just an illusion. There was tremendous life just waiting to burst forth. If our reality is only based on what we can see with our own eyes, then we will have to disregard love which cannot be seen but has the power for one person to give their life for another. I have seen the power of love and hope and faith and I know they're real. Love reminds us there is more than meets the eye. Our faith reminds us that there is life under the hard surface of what seems hopeless.

As we enter into these holiest of weeks, we're asked to look beyond the physical. We're asked to see with the eyes of faith. We are asked to look for resurrection and new life even when all seems to be over and there is no hint of hope. That's when our faith calls us to be heroic and stand on the faith that Moses had when he marched his people out of Egypt or the love of Bishop Oscar Romero as he sat with the suffering peasants in Salvador and shared their plight or the faith of Mary at the cross when she held on to the sure hope that this was not the end of her son's story. We stand on the shoulders on many faithful ancestors who in the face of suffering and death stood up straight and became a light of hope for the people around them. Let's be that light of hope, ourselves, as we head for another holy week and Easter. Let's not allow the sting of death or the hopelessness of situations in our lives or the violence in our world to have the last word. No, let's stand in the face of death and seeming hopelessness, remembering the One who rose from the dead, and shout LIFE!
