Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week our readings talk about the hospitality of Abraham and Sarah waiting, on the three men who come to visit their tent and the hospitality of Mary and Martha who welcome Jesus into their home. The open their hearts and homes to their guests. In both situations, they are blessed for their hospitality. Sarah is told that she will conceive a child in her old age and Mary receives the words of Jesus as she sits at this feet.

These stories from scripture today are much more than just serving house guests. They are asking us to look at ourselves and see if we are hospitable to life.
