PASTOR'S PEN

This Sunday we celebrate All Saints Day and remember all the Saints, canonized by the church, and those from our families who have been the Saints inspiring us to be better people. Our first reading from Revelation speaks of the great multitude wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. The last line refers to this multitude:

“These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb.”

We look to this cloud of witnesses who call to us to keep going and never give up. They remind us that we have a mission to be disciples in the world and to bring love and compassion and joy to a world that seems so torn and divided. They are the unsung heroes: mothers and grandmothers who have raised children on their own, fathers who have worked multiple jobs to care for their families, poor folks who have spent their lives homeless on the streets, mentally ill who have always been misunderstood, people who have never been able to kick their addictions, those who have been so scarred by early abuse and never able to recover. It's all of those who have been overlooked as “Saints” who call us to push on and realize we are called, as they were, to do our best to make the world better by our presence.
