



STRANGERS NO LONGER

As most of you know, the Nativity/St. Charles circle has been assisting the family of Luz Ramos for a few years now. While the family was denied asylum at their hearing in March, they were also allowed to remain in the U.S. for now. Luz has had medical issues since we met her, and in recent months they have become very serious. Because our parishes have been so generous in supporting this immigrant family, we want to be completely transparent about the medical and financial realities they face.

Luz was hospitalized in July & again last week, both via the ER. She has emergency Medicare so much has been taken care of, but as we've all experienced, even with the best insurance one continues to receive bills for months. Luz is now diagnosed with end stage renal disease. Her kidneys are barely functioning with lots of medicine, and she is very close to requiring dialysis. We've had to have office visits with many specialists, none of which take emergency Medicaid. With no insurance, most initial visits are \$200 if they're even willing to see the uninsured. Luz had a colonoscopy which without insurance cost \$2,300. In addition to all this, her 15 year old son Johnny was also diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes last month. He's receiving medical care.

We have received some funds from Strangers No Longer as well as the Nativity/ St Charles savings account, which were donations from parishioners over the years. To help continue to pay the current and future medical bills, we are making a one-time appeal to both parishes for the month of September. **Charlie Tazzia will be here to talk to us about the situation in the next few weeks.** We need your help & are willing to answer any questions you have. Designated envelopes will be out by Mary's altar for you to use for a donation. Please make checks payable to Nativity with Luz Ramos in memo.

In total transparency we must also share that Luz is considering wanting to return to Guatemala for her final days. The children want to remain here. It is all very sad. Thank you for your consideration.
