Covid19 protocols. The Center for Disease Control has lifted its warning about social distancing at six feet. Because a good number of our parishioners have underlying health concerns or are caring for those who have such concerns, we will continue to social distance on Mary's altar side of the church. We will all continue to wear masks in church, based on a consultation with the parish pastoral council and the fact that Southeast Michigan still has a high level of the virus being transmitted.

Holy Communion. Last weekend, we began again to have the option of receiving the real presence of Jesus in the chalice. The Holy Spirit made clear a thousand years ago that when we receive Jesus in only one form (usually under the appearance of bread), we receive the whole Lord. So, we don't have to receive both forms in order to be fully united sacramentally with the Lord.

Over the centuries, for reasons such as the spread of disease, the chalice was limited to the priest; a great gift from the Second Vatican Council was the restoring of the option to receive the Lord from the chalice. This is an option. If you are ill, please do not receive from the chalice, because germs can be passed on even in Communion. (Continued below)

Bible Question of the Week

In today's 1st reading, the Lord reacts to his people's sin passionately. They had made a molten calf to worship as their God. They violated the first and most fundamental of the commandments, the one that binds them to the Lord in a relationship of exclusive loyalty: "You shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:3). Atop the mountain conversing with God, Moses is unaware of the people's idolatry. God no longer refers to them as his people but as Moses' people. How does Moses respond to God's plan to inflict punishment by destroying the people? What was God's response to Moses? What does this tell us about the character of God and how we may approach him in prayer?

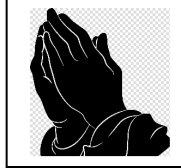

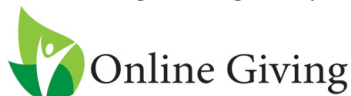
