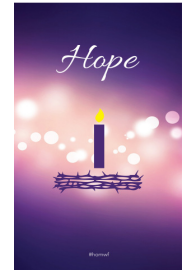

**1st Sunday in
Advent**



Praised be Jesus Christ! Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. Jesus tells us that He is coming soon, that we do not know the day or hour but that salvation is on its way. Let us rejoice in the celebration of the Eucharist as He comes today until He comes in full glory.

All Souls Month/Black Catholic History Month, These days we pray for those from our parish who have died as well as our family members. As often happens as the weather gets colder, more people pass away and make their transition. Let's accompany them with our prayer. As we remember Black Catholic History Month, one of the people we remember is Father Norman DuKette, the first Black Catholic priest in Michigan. Father, like so many early Black Catholic leaders, came from the Maryland/District of Columbia parish communities which produced so many leaders. Father was ordained in Detroit in 1926 and was the founder of one of the several Black Catholic parishes which were opened in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. As the French, Irish, German and Polish communities founded national or ethnic parishes, on the east and west sides, the Black Catholic parishes were founded at Sacred Heart (east side), Holy Ghost (east side), St. Benedict the Moor (west side), Holy Family (Inkster), Our Lady of Victory (North Side) and Christ the King (Flint). Father DuKette founded St. Benedict the Moor (1927) and went on to found Christ the King in Flint in 1929, where he served for the rest of his priesthood. He was a kind and faithful priest and we are grateful for his priesthood and his memory.

Covid19 protocols: The Center for Disease Control has lifted its warning about social distancing at six feet. But Southeast Michigan still has a high level of the virus being transmitted. If you are symptom-free, please feel free to sit on the St. Joseph side of the church where social distancing is no longer required.

Holy Communion: We again have the option of receiving the real presence of Jesus in the chalice. The Holy Spirit made clear a thousand years ago that when we receive Jesus in only one form (usually under the appearance of bread), we receive the whole Lord. So, we don't have to receive both forms to be fully united sacramentally with the Lord.

Bible Question of the Week**

As we begin our new church year in Advent, we move from Luke's gospel to Matthew. We hear Jesus continue to speak with his disciples about end times. In Luke we heard Jesus talk about signs to come before his return. Today we hear Him compare the time of his return as in the days of Noah. *"In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man."* Jesus warns them to always be prepared. He is not saying don't marry or have a social life. He wants to be included in all aspects of our lives. How often do you take time to recognize his presence within you? Do you welcome him in your important and not so important times? Do you feel prepared for Jesus' sudden return? Advent is a wonderful time to be intentional with how we spend personal time with our Lord.
