Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins to show his disciples that he must suffer greatly from the elders, chief priests, and scribes and be killed and raised on the third day. He goes on to tell them what is required of those who choose to follow Him with these words. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" The message is the same for Christians today. Our faith journey must be one of selfdenial, taking up our cross, and following Jesus. This is not a one-time event, but a life-long process, Everyone has been given a measure of faith to begin the journey. Following the will and mission of His Father was not an easy journey for Jesus. Following Jesus will not always be easy for us either.

You may want to spend some quite time reflecting on where you are on the journey. When and how have you practiced self-denial? When and how have you taken up your cross? In what way have you progressed on your journey to follow Jesus?


