

Praised be Jesus Christ! Today, the Lord once more is put to the test. Our spiritual tradition tells us that a thousand questions don't make up a single doubt. It's always good to check our attitude with the Lord: are we open enough with Jesus to ask questions (if not, we'll probably keep Him at an arm's length)? Are we trusting and loving as we ask questions (or, putting Him to the test)?

Here I am, send me! These weeks, we are praying about serving in ministries in the parish. We'll sign up on November 5th. A reminder that sometimes the Lord gives us clear spiritual signs; most of the time, the Lord wants us to use our reason: to look around and see what needs to be done.

Praying for Peace. Please keep praying for peace in the Holy Land. The Vatican diplomatic corps has been working on a just and peaceful solution to the crisis and the ongoing tensions in the region. Pope Francis' counsel has been wise and you might spend some time looking up his words and prayers on the Internet.

The Synod. Pope Francis has called a gathering of Bishops and members of the Church to Rome to pray and think about directions for the Church's care of people. As you may have read, for the first time, lay people will be voting in the synod. The synods have been held every five years or so. Pope Francis has decided that the members of the gathering would not speak to reporters during the time the synod is meeting. As you may know, there are Catholic news services which represent every opinion in the Church. For a reasonable source of information of what goes on in Rome, you might try Crux:Now. Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In the Gospel the past few weeks, Jesus spoke parables to the chief priests and elders about the Kingdom of Heaven. He exposed what made them unworthy to enter His Kingdom. In today's Gospel we hear how the Jewish leaders enlisted Herod to participate in a plot to entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples with the Herodians to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status." Notice they start off with flattering speech. "Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites?" (If He said that taxes should be paid, He could be accused of denying the sovereignty of God over Israel (making Himself unpopular with the Jewish people). If He said that taxes should not be paid, He made Himself an enemy of Rome.) So how did Jesus answer and how did they respond? Have you been questioned by someone with the intent to entrap you and challenge your faith as a Christian? For today, what does the saying: "Pay Caesar what belongs to Caesar and God what belongs to God" mean?


