"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."

Jesus, Matt 22:37

Praised be Jesus Christ! In the final test of Jesus on the Temple Mount, a Pharisee asks Jesus about what was the greatest commandment, the commandment by which all other commandments should be interpreted. Jesus gave the Pharisee and He gives us today the Golden Rule: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." Let's check our lives again today in response to Jesus' teaching. If we find we need to change, let's thank God for showing us a better way.

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

On this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus continues to be tested by the religious authorities of that time to discredit Him among the people. In today's Gospel, the Pharisees gathered and asked Him, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus answered, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." What is the relationship between the first and the second commandment? Why is it that the love of God and the love of neighbor constitute a summary of the law and the prophets (see:1 John 4: 20-21)? Who does Jesus say are our neighbors? How are we able to love them? Who represent the Pharisees today?
