Praised be Jesus Christ! Today, St. Mark becomes our evangelist for the year ahead. We begin every Church year with the Scripture showing us the world in need of Jesus. Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

As we end the liturgical year of Ordinary Time and today begin the Holy Season of Advent, the Gospel messages are similar. In Saturday's Gospel Jesus said to His disciples, "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." In today's Gospel, Jesus tells them, "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch." "May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" Advent, (from Latin adventus, "coming"), in the church calendar is the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. The Gospel tells us it is also a time of preparation for the Second Coming of Christ. We are His servants left in charge, each with our own work. How will you use your time during Advent and beyond to: Be watchful? Be Alert? References: Lk 21:34-36; MK 13:33-37
