**Praised be Jesus Christ!** Today we rejoice in the Lord on the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the promise of the Angel Gabriel to Our Lady is announced to us as well: *of His Kingdom, there will be no end*. Thank God for the living Word of God.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent is also Christmas Eve day. Among the three parishes, we will also have a 5 PM Mass at Nativity and an 8 PM Mass at St. Charles and Midnight Mass at St. Augustine/St. Monica. On Christmas Day, Mass will be offered here at Nativity at 9:30.

**Planning ahead:** Next Sunday is the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God and New Year's Day. Because it is on a Monday this year, it is not a holy day of obligation. There will be Eucharistic Adoration at St. Augustine/St. Monica on New Year's Eve/Watch Night from 7 until midnight. The one Mass for the three parishes will be here at Nativity at 9:30 on New Year's Day. Please reach out and welcome the people who come from other parishes.

**Pray about who you will invite to Mass for Christmas.** Many times, the Holy Spirit touches people who come to holiday Masses and they return to practicing their faith. Let's all do our part to open the door.

**Praying for Peace.** Let's keep on asking, especially praying the rosary for peace.

**Family of Parishes** Last Sunday, the designation of Rivard Street in honor of Father Norman Thomas took place and we are grateful to the work of Ms. Suzan Pozey who led the committee in having the street signs installed. In each of the parishes, work has begun in the short transition from Advent to Christmas. Nativity's Christmas Program, with the collaboration of members and resources of the other parishes, was in full gear and over 750 people were served. St. Charles hosted a large congregation for the funeral Mass of Father David's brother, Dr. Robert Preuss. It was good to see so many of the Capuchin friars and Father's homily was an inspiration. The Christmas Bazaar at St. Augustine/St. Monica was beautifully planned and decorated, had wonderful vendors and was well attended. St. Elizabeth had a successful planning meeting for the year ahead as we position ourselves for *a future full of hope* (Jeremiah 29:11)



# **Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week**

On this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent, the Gospel tells of Angel Gabriel's visit to Mary. His greeting was, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." Mary was troubled by his greeting. He said, "Do not be afraid. Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." As Mary was betrothed to Joseph, of the house of David, and had no relations with a man, Angel Gabriel said, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of will Most High overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. Mary replied, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." How do you perceive God's visits in your life? How has He visited you during your Advent journey? Have you been a visit from God in the life of others? How have you experienced God's favor in your life? How does this text help you to discover the visits of God in your life and how you should respond?


