A CUP OF JOE

Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening." 1 Samuel 3:9

In 1st Corinthians 7:35 Paul states: I say for your benefit; not to put a restraint upon you, but to promote what is appropriate and *to secure* undistracted devotion to the Lord. In the readings today, there are a lot of passages to draw inspiration from to help us overcome the noise and distractions of that world. "Here I am Lord " and "Speak Lord your servant is listening" are two parts of scripture that communicate that our focus should be on Christ, but we often put our focus elsewhere. Sometimes in life, we are so caught up in our interests that we miss the calls of others. Children often miss the calls of their parents because they are too distracted playing video games, watching a movie, or simply on social media. Can you recall moments in your life when you were too busy or too attuned to things you felt were more important or entertaining that you missed the mark on what is important?

Let us ask ourselves, "What often distracts me from hearing the call of God?" Could it be working late or that over-dedication to the gym? Perhaps it's your collegiate studies, a book from your favorite author, or your affinity for a certain hobby. It could even be that so-called can't-miss sports game your favorite team is in.

What is God telling you? How many times have you had the feeling to reach out to someone?

To hear the voice of our God, we have to put away distractions and have moments of silence and meditation so we can hear and respond to the voice of our God just as Samuel and Eli did. And just as God did with Eli, when he speaks he will provide us with a platform to do his will and it won't just benefit us, but the kingdom as a whole.

So let's pray for each one of us to remove some of our distractions. Let's spend time in meditation and say to the lord every morning:

"Here I am lord, speak for your servant is listening."

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In today's Gospel we see John the Baptist as evangelist. He was with two of his disciples and as Jesus walked by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said. "What are you looking for?" They said, "Rabbi," (translated means Teacher) "where are you staying?" He said, "Come, and you will see." After spending the day with Jesus, Andrew, one of the two, went to find his brother, Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Christ). Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter). Simon could have laughed or ignored his brother Andrew, but something must have been different about Andrew. He knew he had found a treasure and felt a need to share his discovery with his family and friends. Thanks to his enthusiasm, Simon, the future St. Peter, met Jesus. We should ask ourselves: Have I really discovered Jesus? Have I discovered the love, hope and joy that come from Him as Savior? If so, have I overcome any fear, timidity, or anything that keeps me from sharing this treasure with others?


Food Pantry Items Needed This Week: Many thanks for your generosity! This week we need Tuna, Spaghetti Sauce and Noodles.


