A reflection from your DJ (Deacon John)

A special word we can come to know as we read the Scriptures this week is the word "process." One of the classes for the diaconate or pastoral associate formation was taught by a wonderful nun. The class was to help us to be able to present to the parishioners in our ministries. We were told not to use the phrase, "Here is a program or event for you!" We had to give a presentation to our class and could only use the phrase, "Here is a process for you to experience." The process is described in the Gospel this week (Mark 1:14-20) when we hear, "repent and believe in the Gospel" or when He tells the apostles to, "come after me and I will make you fishers of men". Jesus is beginning the <u>PROCESS</u> for these disciples!

Recently, I was invited to attend a Mass and dinner to celebrate four seminarians at different stages of the <u>process</u> of becoming priests. They each gave a summary of each of their calls to the priesthood. As I was reading today's Gospel in preparation for this article, I recalled how the seminarians at that event explained the <u>process</u> of how they decided to pursue the priesthood. They were being called by Jesus just like the Gospel!

The men in formation talked about their families as they began this journey (process.) Another part of today's Gospel that has always touched me as a son, a brother, a dad, and a grandfather is the one line after Jesus started the <u>process</u> by calling "James, the son of Zebedee and his brother John." Their <u>process</u> included following Jesus and leaving their father, Zebedee, in the boat. That began a <u>process</u> for Zebedee as he watched his sons follow Jesus. The <u>process</u> for him was a bit complicated but after some time, as he prayed, the process brought him great joy.

We may often experience a <u>process</u> in our lives. When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist the <u>process</u> continues. We try with the help of Jesus to make the best of our lives. That involves listening to Jesus in the Gospels which results in us serving those in the world that are in need. We can begin the <u>process</u> of following the Lord as his Disciple. Being in that <u>process</u> is a great New Year's Resolution. Enjoy the prayers and process! Spirituality is a beautiful process of growth in our relationship with God!

That worked for James and John.

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In today's Gospel, the time of waiting is over. God is about to begin His reign. John the Baptist belonged to the time of preparation and completed his mission. He has been put in prison and silenced. Jesus belongs to the time of the establishment of the reign. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." As He passed by the Sea of Galilee, He calls His first disciples who will become the builders of His kingdom far beyond Galilee. He saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." He called James and his brother John who were in a boat mending their nets. They left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed Him. They followed Him immediately! All Christians are called to discipleship - to be kingdom builders sharing Good News. How do you respond? Is there a sense of urgency in your daily life or do you tend to say, "wait a minute?" If so, what causes you to procrastinate?
