Thomas, 'the Doubter"

In today's gospel, we learn that a week after Jesus' passing, doubt can be a resourceful tool. In the Gospel, we hear a little more about one of the more interesting figures in Biblical history: Thomas the Apostle. Not much is written about him, but there is much to learn from him. Thomas is an esteemed figure who represents a moment in the Christian body when we all have doubt about the power of God. Thomas is exposed as a doubter as he states confidently, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." Thomas wanted to physically touch Christ to know for certain that it was Jesus who said he would rise from the dead.

Jesus understands Thomas' insecurities and allows him to step out of his doubt into the faith that he will undeniably carry until his death. At times we can all be like Thomas doubting the power and the word of God, but God can use anything to bring us closer to him. Jesus uses Thomas' doubt as an instrument of faith. Thomas doubted so we don't have to. His spiritual battle led him and the others to recognize that Jesus is actually who he says he is: the son of God. Hence the sourness of doubt is now transformed into the sweet fruit of faithfulness to help build the kingdom of God. Jesus says, "*Blessed are those* who have *not seen* and yet *believe.*"

Prayer

Lord grant that any doubt we have be changed into a faith so strong in bold, that we can make people see that you are who you say you are. Change us, form us, and inspire us to grow into a deeper relationship with you.

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In today's Gospel we hear that on the evening of the first day of the week (Easter Sunday), the disciples are behind locked doors for fear of the Jews. Jesus enters and stands in their midst and says to them, "Peace be with you." After He reveals the marks of His crucifixion, Jesus again speaks words of peace. He gives them peace even though it appearsa they had abandoned Him. Peter even denied he knew Him. Jesus also spoke words of forgiveness on the cross, completed the work of atonement for humanity, and now blesses those who have done Him wrong with peace! To be forgiven is to be made free and at peace, set in a new direction. We might call God's forgiveness our commissioning. When we share peace during Mass, it reminds us of this commission and the Resurrection to new life. This is not only what Jesus said to do, it is what Jesus did. Do you view forgiving others as a duty of discipleship? Do you struggle in this area and lack true peace? It may be helpful to meditate on Jesus' words, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you. And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

2024 FATHER SINGER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP


