About four years ago, the Family of Parish structure began. At the time we had concerns as to how this would work and what would it mean for us. Our fears were eased by Br. Ray and Fr. Dan and we didn't see a lot of change.

Now four years later we have seen and been through a lot of change. Br. Ray was transferred, Fr. Dan died, and we have a new team of priests. But we aren't the only ones who have endured the changes. Think of our priest team or as they are called Priests-in-Solidum. They no longer have the luxury of ministering to one flock, they now minister to five. They struggle to get to know their flocks. The change for them is difficult too. Our priests and Deacon John love our parishes and do what is necessary to ensure our needs are taken care of. They are never more than a phone call away.

Now, due to the Archdiocese's restructuring plan, more changes are coming. The Archdiocese has instructed us to come up with a plan of viability for the family. Maybe they are doing it this way so they don't look like the bad guy, maybe they really want us to have a say, who knows. All I know is that we, as part of the family, can't sit back, we need to help, and we need to have our voices heard. We can no longer stand alone!

I'm asking you to please attend the meeting on May 10th, "Enduring Faith: Looking into the Future", a meeting to discuss Growth and a Vision for our Future. Come to listen, come to ask your questions, and come to show that Nativity is a pillar in this family, willing to work together and that it's going to fight for our family.

I know our Saturdays are busy, I'm personally hoping I miss power washing our home in Lexington to attend the meeting. I know many will want to start planting their flowers, but remember we still can get frost till the middle of May so they can wait a week. Whatever reason you have for not coming, please reconsider and come.

Let us be like Jesus' disciples and go out to tend and feed the sheep!

EVANGELIZATION COMMITTEE BIBLE QUESTION OF THE WEEK

On this third Sunday of Easter, the Gospel tells of the third appearance of Jesus post-resurrection to seven disciples while out fishing with Peter. They had caught nothing all night. At dawn, from the shore, Jesus spoke to them (not recognizing Him). "Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So, the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When they came ashore, they saw a fire with fish on it and bread, and Jesus told them to bring some fish they had caught. "Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast" After the meal, Jesus speaks with Simon Peter. The community of John's Gospel probably looked down on Peter due to his denial of Jesus. This dialogue with Simon Peter is a reversal of his three denials. Asking Simon Peter three times, "Do you love me?" and responding yes, each time He tells him: "Feed my lambs; Tend my sheep; Feed my sheep." Peter is forgiven. Having been restored, he is sent on mission and is to be as Jesus, even unto sacrificing for the flock. As Jesus has fed Peter in this meal and as Jesus feeds us in the Eucharist, so He also sends us to follow him, asking that we offer our lives in service and sacrifice. Jesus asks us today, "Do you Me?" How do you answer this question with confidence? How does your journey and mission proclaim your love for God? How else does this Gospel speak to you?


