Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

During Lent, we have heard how Jesus revealed himself as the Son of God to some (Peter, James and John in the account of Jesus' Transfiguration; the Samaritan women at the well; the healed blind man; and disciples, Martha and others in the raising of Lazarus). To others this revelation was hidden. In today's Gospel, it difficult to hear of the torment Jesus endured. In obedience to the Father, He paid the ultimate sacrifice. At the time of His death, His identity was once again revealed to some. *But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice and gave up his spirit. And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God!"* You may want to consider and pray about the following questions during this Holy Week. How has Jesus revealed Himself to you? How have you experienced the depth of His love for you? How has it transformed your heart – your life? Why does He seem to still be hidden from many today? REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God!"* You may want to consider and pray about the following questions during this Holy Week. REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

REFLECTION BY SR. ELLEN

Keep your eyes on Jesus

- Ushering in the holiest week of the church year, Palm Sunday sheds light on our life's journey. Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem, to the wild acclaims of the cheering crowd who waved palm branches. Yet Jesus did this on a humble donkey, leading the way into his kingdom, knowing that this was just the overture to a week of deep passion.
- We also begin this Holy Week waving our palm branches and processing joyously singing praise. Yet, all too quickly, we plunge from glory to unimaginable grief with today's readings describing the Suffering Servant, followed by the psalm of abandonment used by Jesus on the cross, and the reading of his passion. Our human nature recoils: this is not the way our Savior should be treated. This is not the way our life should go. And yet it does. One year I bask in light and hope, and the next sees my dream shredded. Jesus cries out, Father, *why have you abandoned me?* Yet, his heart did not waver from conquering death through his own death and resurrection.
- Holy Week is a week filled to overflowing with opportunities to nurture our relationship with Jesus. It is also a good time for quiet, reflective prayer. For those of us for whom it is possible, attending daily Mass is ideal. If that is not possible, read the daily readings and pray with them. What is Jesus leading you to experience? Our liturgical services on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and Holy Saturday invite us to walk closely with Jesus, to grow closer to him and to express gratitude for a Love beyond imagining. If you don't usually come to church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, I encourage you to consider coming this year. These gatherings allow us to take a moment of silence to remember that each of us is here because God created us in love and holds us in existence each and every moment of our lives. And Jesus wants us to know and remember His great love for us, even unto death.
- Our eyes and hearts must be "... stayed on Jesus," as the song goes. Allow Holy Week to be a time to turn our attention to what is holy, what is sacred, what is truly important—what is of God. Let us not take our eyes off Jesus this Holy week, or ever!

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

During Lent, we have heard how Jesus revealed himself as the Son of God to some (Peter, James and John in the account of Jesus' Transfiguration; the Samaritan women at the well; the healed blind man; and disciples, Martha and others in the raising of Lazarus). To others this revelation was hidden. In today's Gospel, it difficult to hear of the torment Jesus endured. In obedience to the Father, He paid the ultimate sacrifice. At the time of His death, His identity was once again revealed to some. *But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice and gave up his spirit. And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God!"* You may want to consider and pray about the following questions during this Holy Week. How has Jesus revealed Himself to you? How have you experienced the depth of His love for you? How has it transformed your heart – your life? Why does He seem to still be hidden from many today?
