

This week we received this message for the parish from Brother Ray:

I've wanted to write this letter so many times and then got distracted or Snoop wanted to go for a walk and then I never got to it. First of all, thank you for the incredible send-off from both parishes. I was and still am so overwhelmed by your goodness and generosity. My days now are pretty different from my life in Detroit. I am involved in a Spirituality group (run by those Jesuits) and meet with a Spiritual Director once a week while going through the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises. I am trying to pray and do some work on my crazy self! These days, I also get to have long walks with Snoop throughout the day and that's usually peaceful unless he decides he doesn't like a dog he sees...then all hell breaks loose! It didn't matter how well the play came off because they were all so cute (especially the sheep!) We will hear the story, once again, of how our God came to be with us out of the deepest love. We will hold the truth of the Incarnation in our hearts and remind ourselves that Christ is born again and again and again whenever we love one another. You have shown me the face of our beloved Christ so many times and I will carry all of you in my heart. Have a Blessed Christmas and a new year filled with all good things and know that your brother misses all of you!
